



Trepucó is a talayotic settlement of some 5,000m² that was originally walled. Today, only a small part of the settlement remains: some fragments of stretches of the wall, two square towers at the western wall, two talayots, the taula enclosure (sanctuary) and some remains of dwellings. These are perfectly visible at the western part of the settlement, thanks to the excavations carried out a few years ago. These are polilobular dwellings with a central patio and outlying rooms. Thus, the settlement differentiated between a communal area (between the large talayot and the taula) and one of domestic spaces.

The settlement was violently destroyed during the second Punic War. The sudden abandonment meant that at the time of the archaeological dig, it was possible to come across very well preserved domestic implements that are exhibited in the Museu de Menorca. The largest talayot and the taula are located in the centre of a "star" built of dry-stone wall in the 18th century that is defensive in character.
