



Located at the eastern end of the beach of the same name, it is a rectangular building with an east to west orientation. To the west it has a portico with three entrances that give access to the narthex ( a place for the faithful who had not yet been baptized), and from this point three naves open out that are separated by pillars that end at the head of the church. This is also tripartite, though with an apsidal centre where the altar was located. These pillars supported some arches that have not been conserved. The baptismal font, made up of a cylindrical monolith on the outside with the shape of a cross on the inside (something unusual in Minorcan basilicas), is currently conserved in the left compartment of the head of the church on the northern part, though originally it would have been at the entrance of the church. Outside of the basilica there are very simple graves and other constructions that were probably monastic. The chronology is from the fifth century A.D.
