



A Minorcan themed museum installed on the first floor of the Claustre del Carme (the Carmen cloister) of Maó that was built between 1750 and 1808. The museum was created from the donations of legacies of Joan Hernández Mora and Francesc Hernández Sanz, who had carried out great educational, research, conservation and protection of Minorcan heritage work.

The general outline of the museum reflects the interior of a Minorcan house. The rooms house fundamentally graphic work and decorative art of the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries (a wide range of furniture, objects and paintings of Minorcan origin). Three collections differ from this general outline by their own identity: the important figures gallery, the cartographic collection and the work of their relatives. The complex is complemented by an extensive library that is also of a local theme. This houses all the bibliographical material that has been published about the island and books by island authors.
