



Cala Morell is a small natural harbour on the northern coast of Ciutadella, where a magnificent necropolis is to be found. A group of fourteen caves artificially excavated in the rock of a small gully, they form the largest and most spectacular necropolis on the island. They were used as a cemetery from the pre-talayotic era to the second century A.D.

The interiors of the largest caves imitate the circular dwellings of the talayotic period. Some also have small patios in front. In Cala Morell there are caves with a ground plan, as well as uneven caves and columns carved out of the same rock to mark different spaces. The most spectacular cave of all presents classical architectural motifs in relief on its façade.
